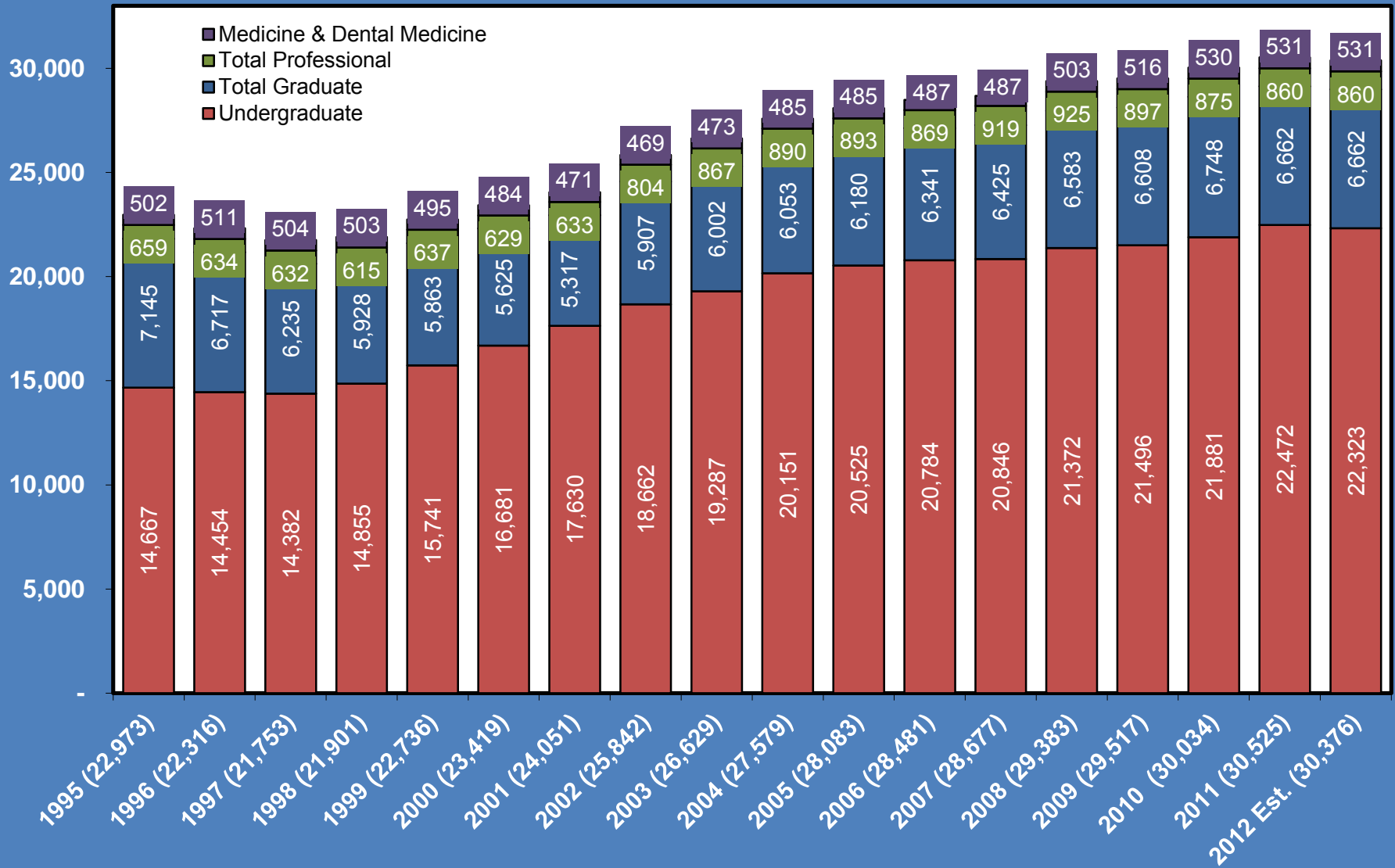

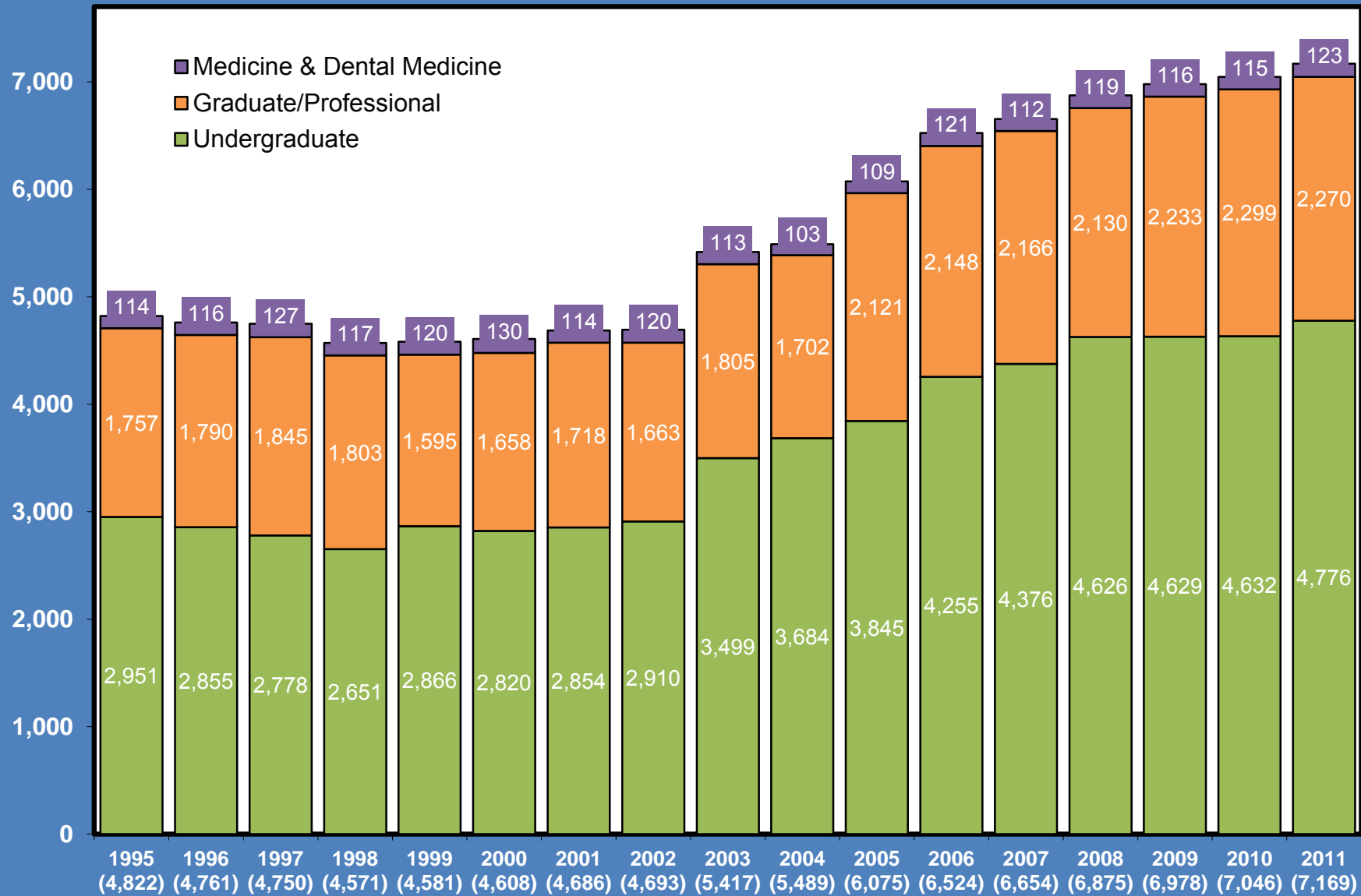

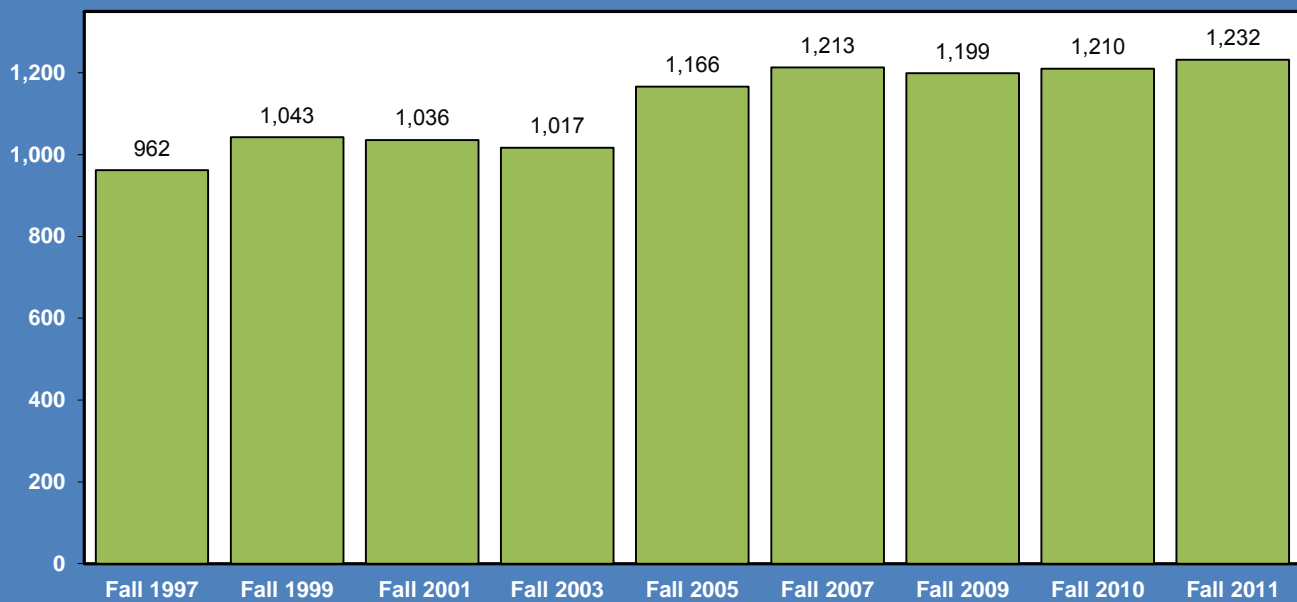

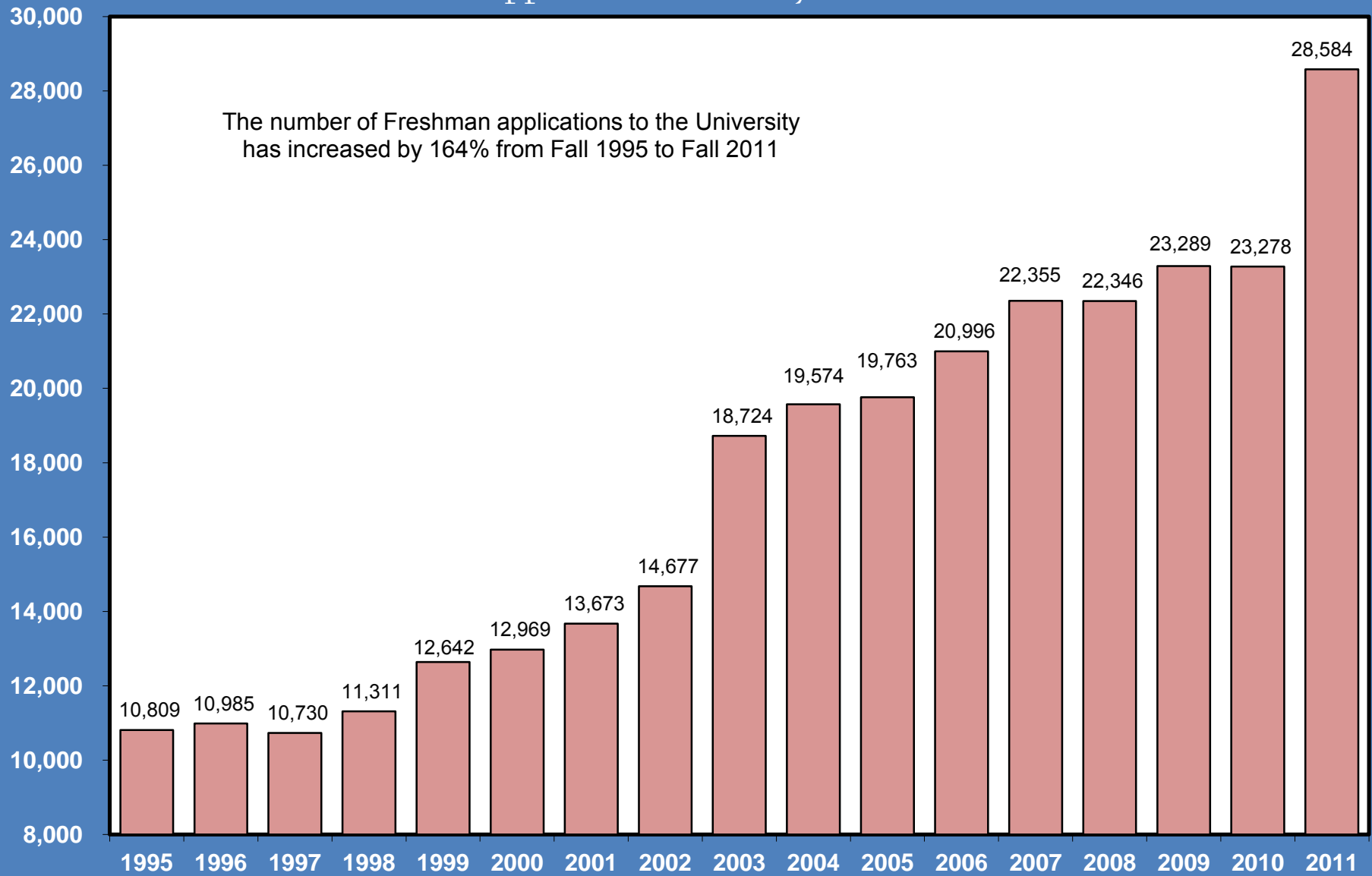

## Freshman Applications for Entry Fall 1995-2011



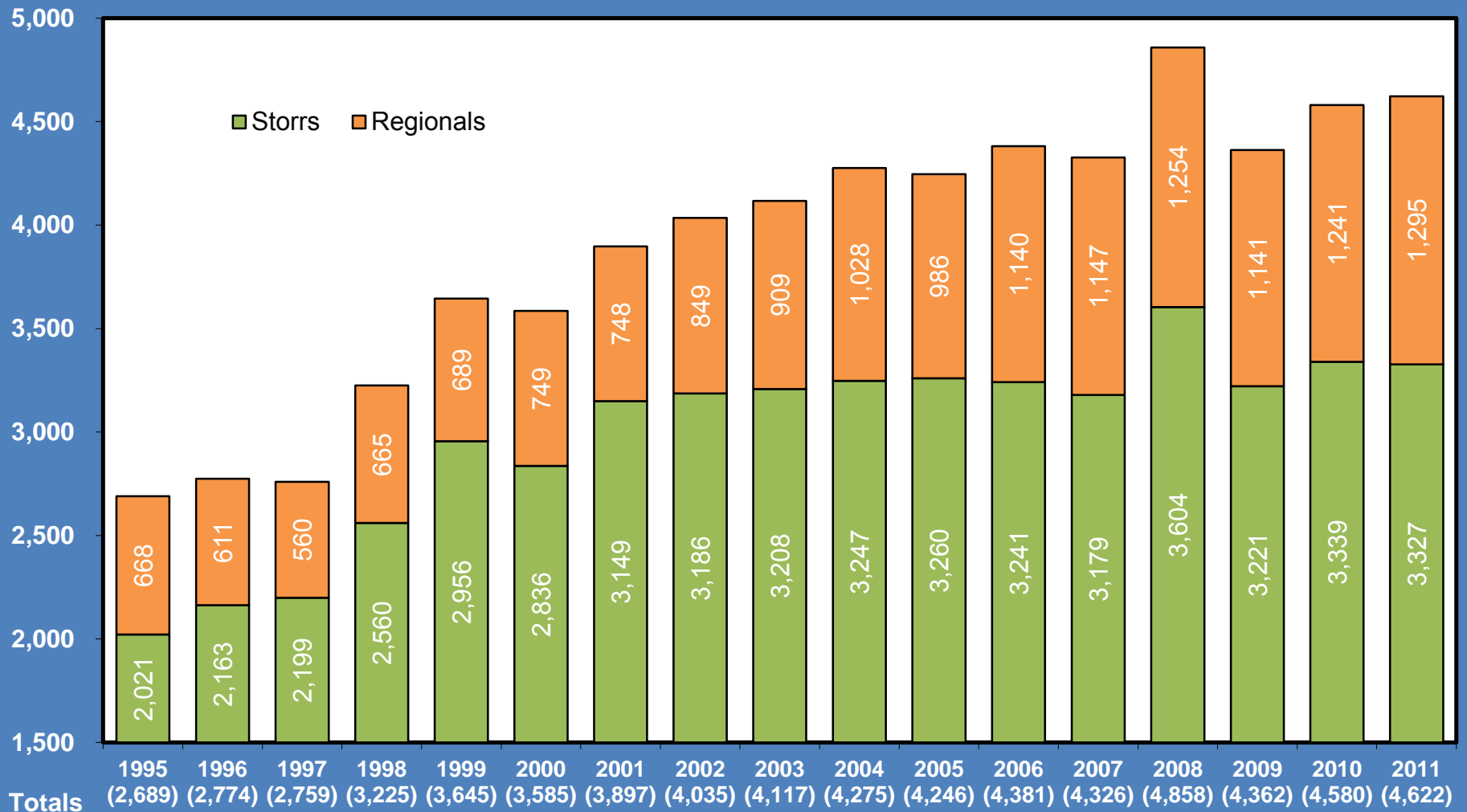

\*First semester Freshman enrollment increased by 72% from Fall 1995 to Fall 2011.

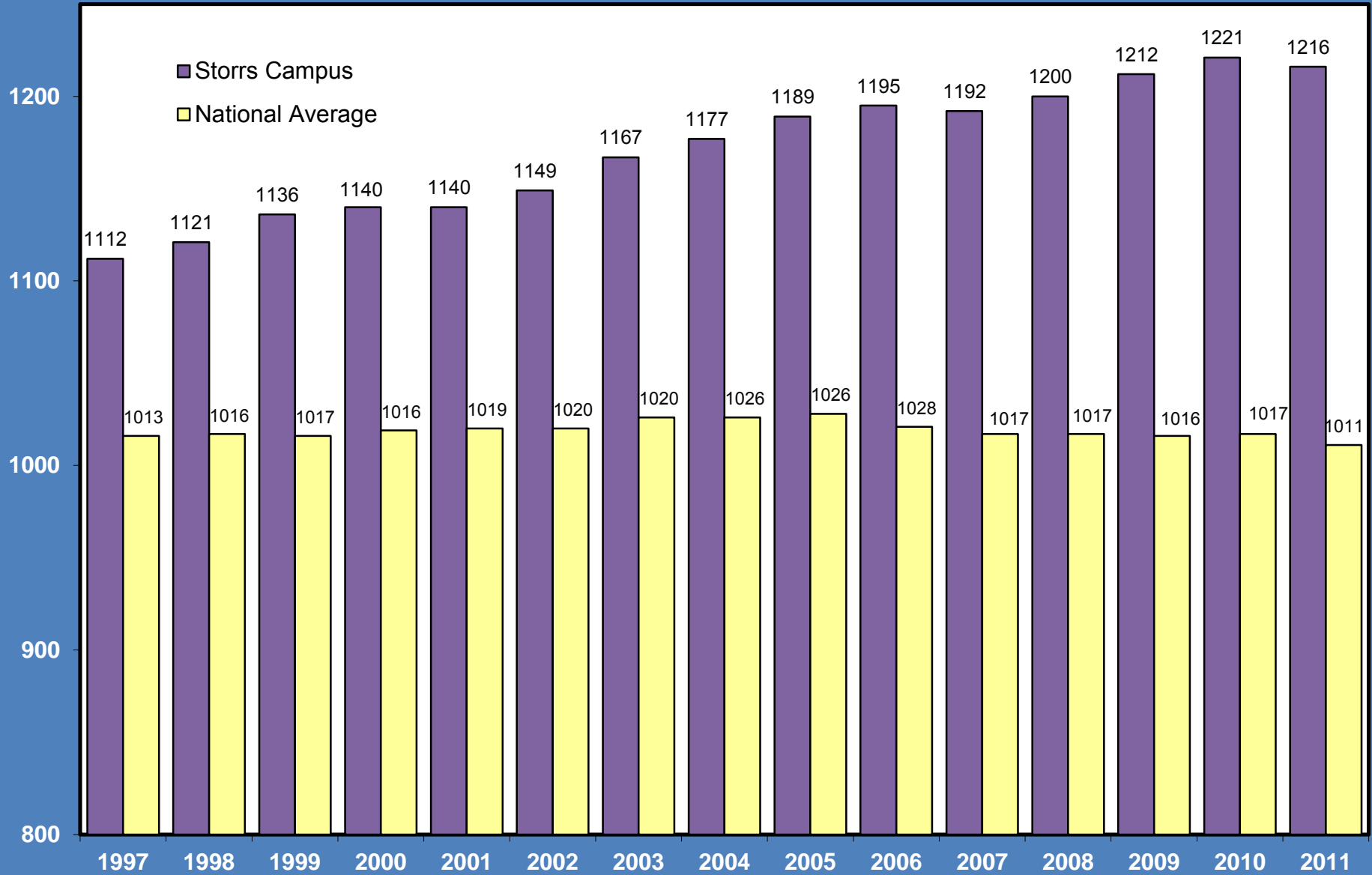
\*Enrollment going forward is projected to stabilize.

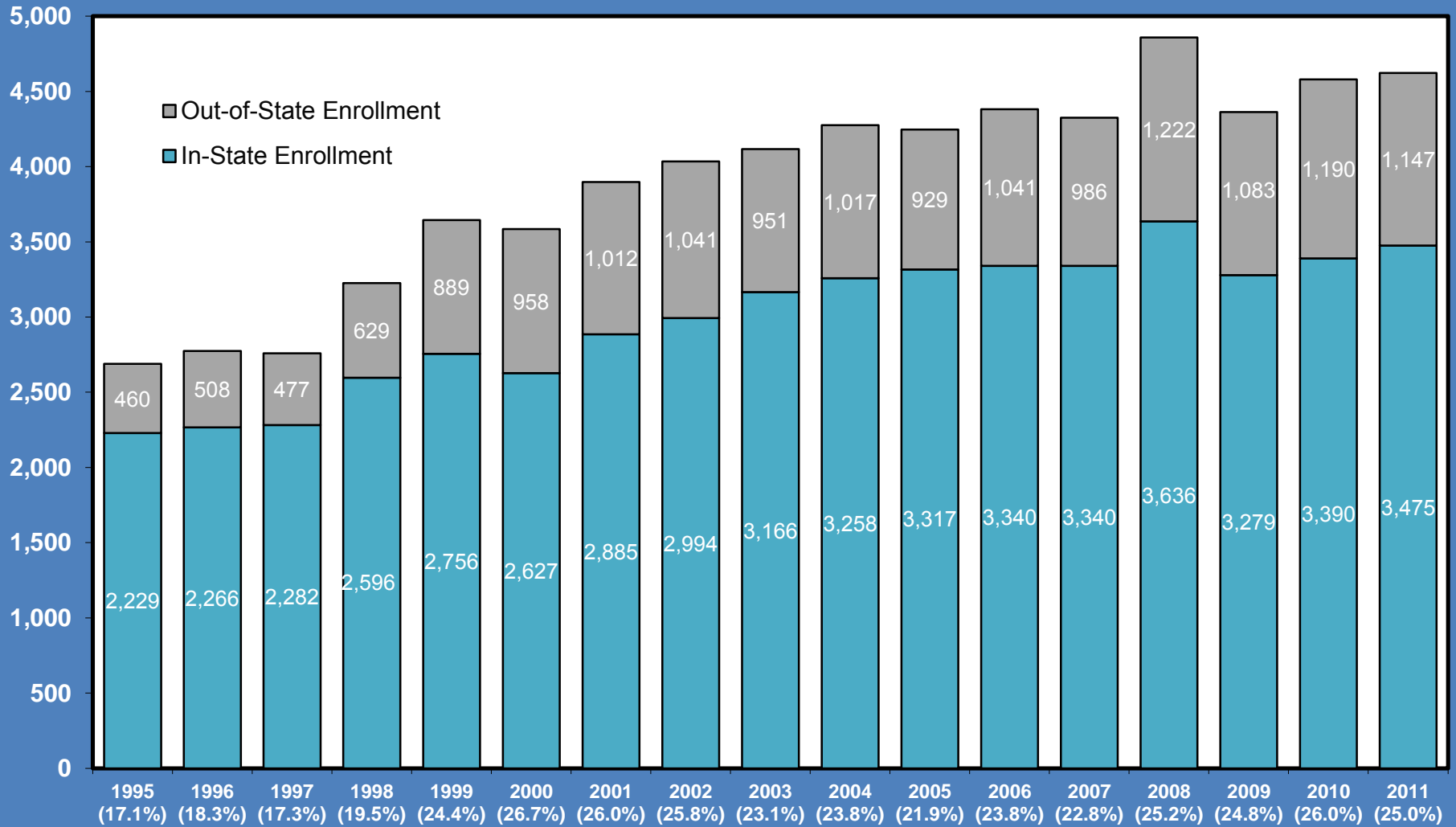
Average Total SAT Scores - Fall 1997-2011

## Freshman In-State and Out-of-State Enrollment - Fall 1995-2011

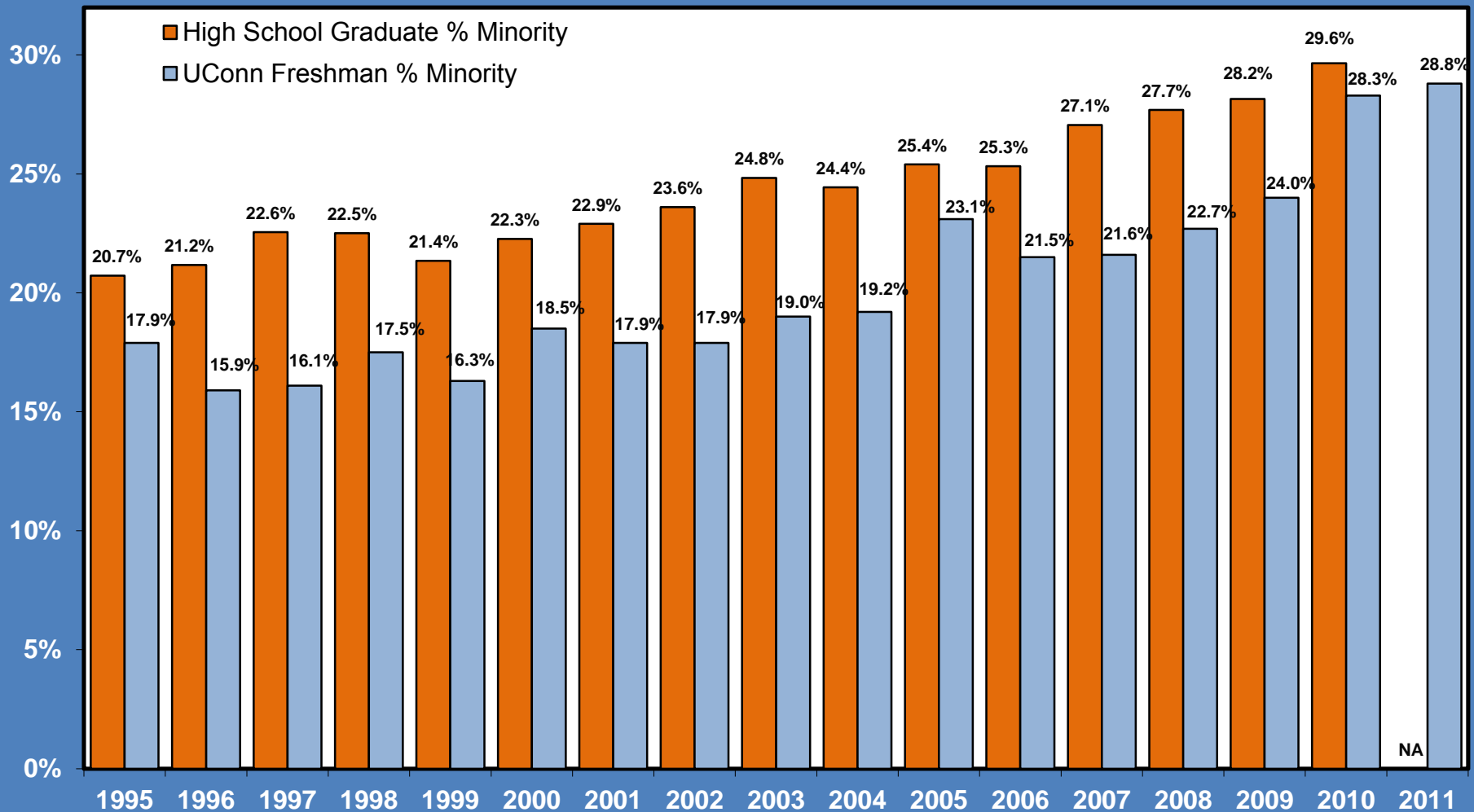


Represents Out-of-State % of Freshman Class

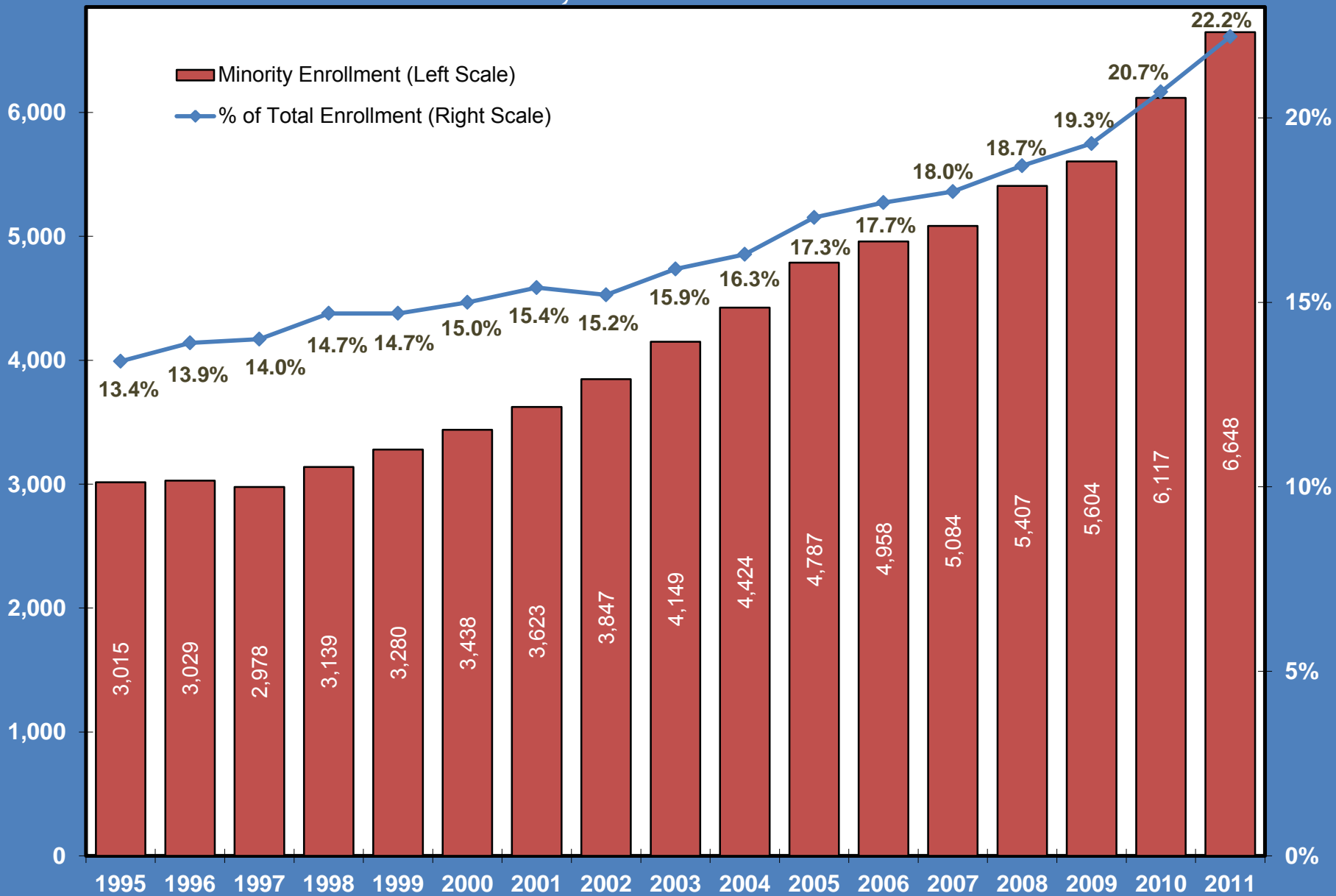
## Freshman Minority Enrollment Trends for Entry Fall 1995-2011

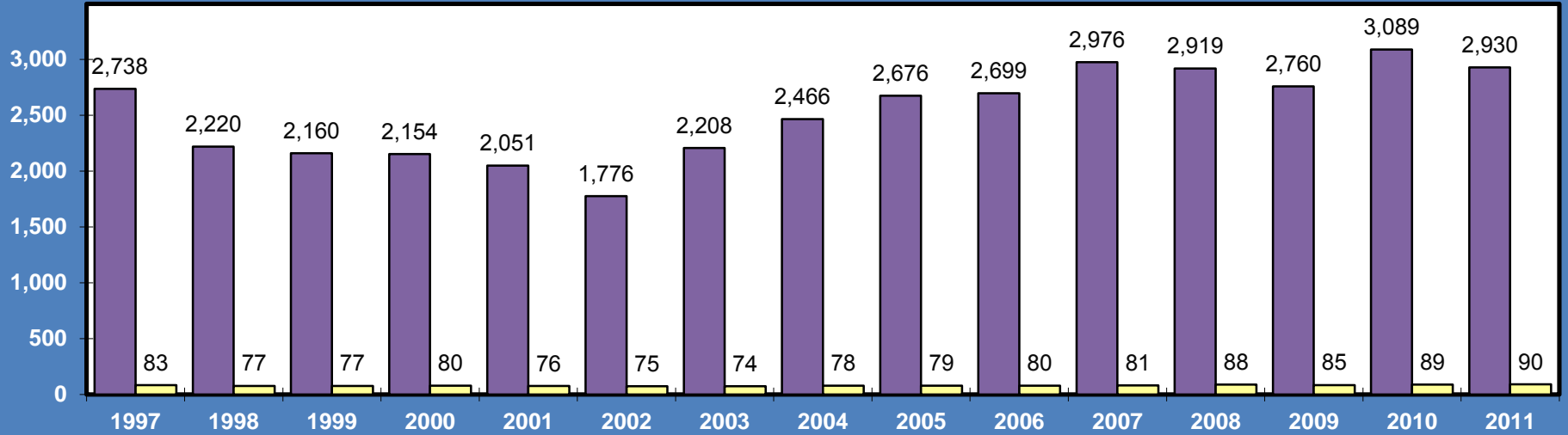

## Total Minority Enrollment - Fall 1995-2011



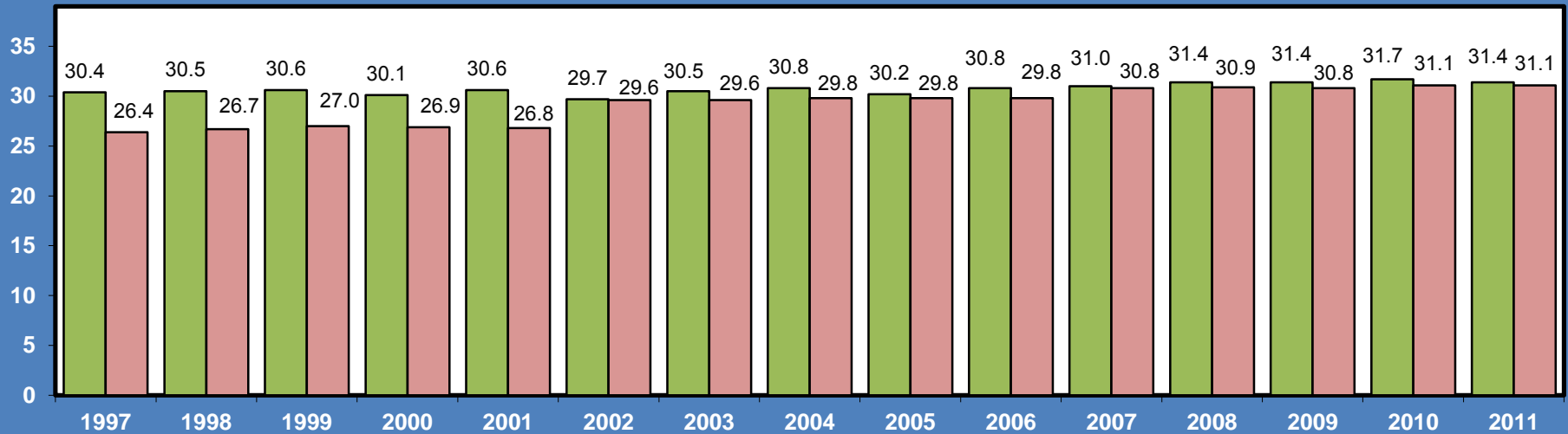

 ■ 1st Year Enrollment



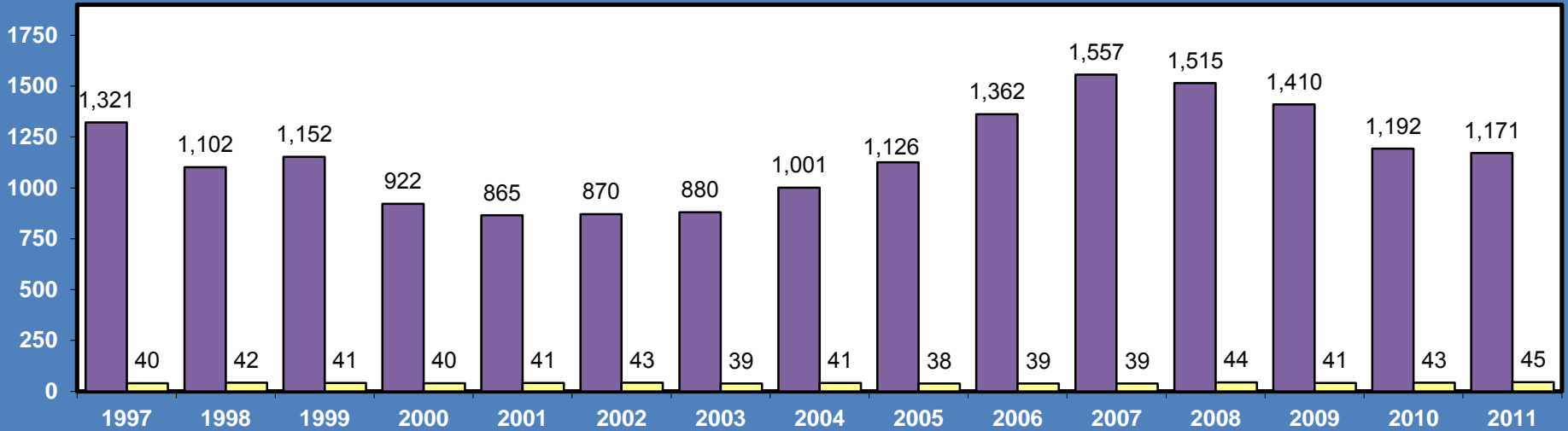

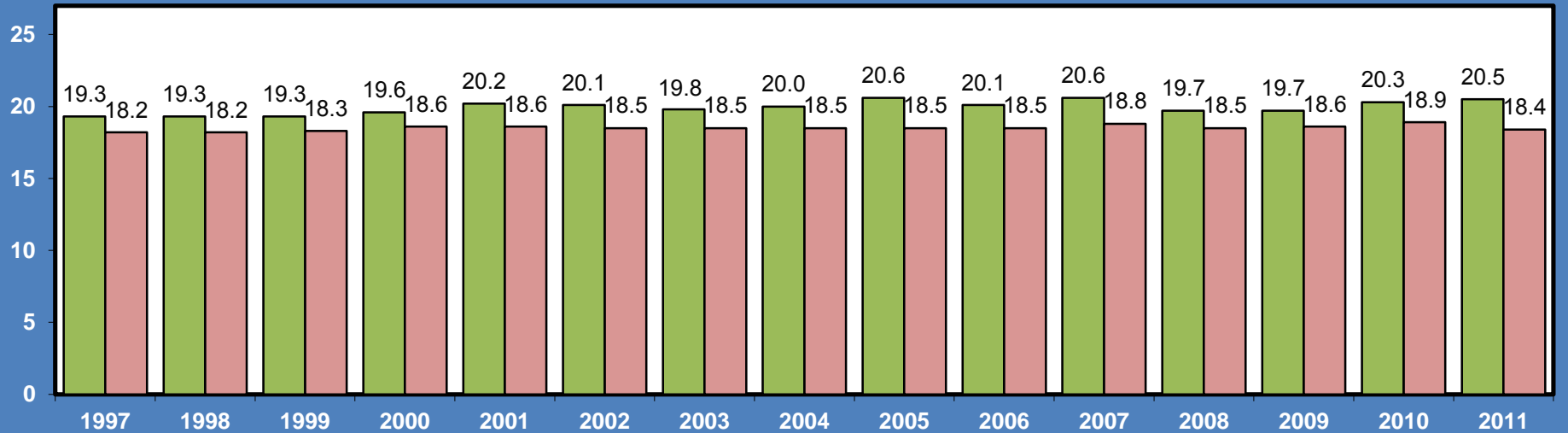

 ■ Enrollments



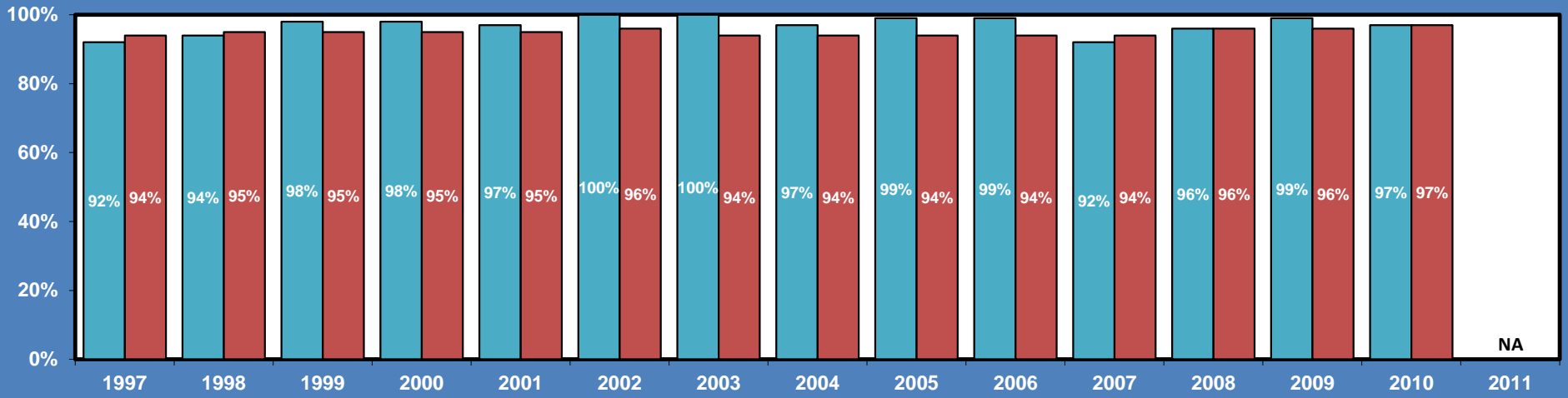

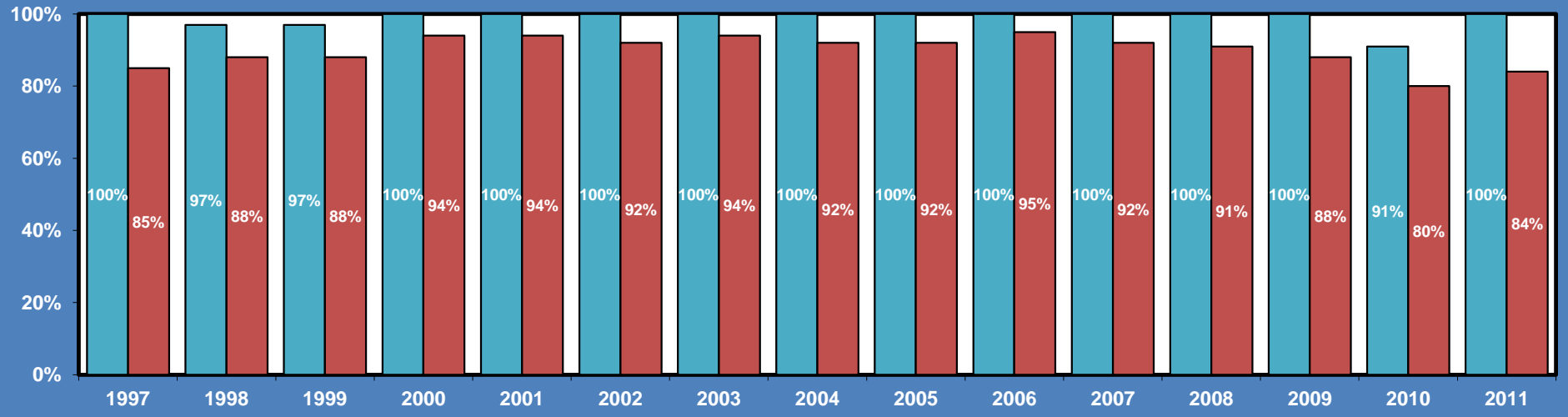
